This paper plate cow craft for kids is super easy and as cute as can be! Add it to your farm-themed activities or your Letter Cc lessons.


Materials


- paper plate
- construction paper or cardstock
- ribbon (optional)
- craft stick
- glue stick
- scissors





Instructions


- l. To begin, draw some simple designs for the cow's ears, nostrils, and spots. I like to do this with a white crayon on black paper since the white stands out.
- 2. Then, draw shapes for the nose and inner ears on pink paper.
- 3. Cut out all of these shapes.
- 4. Glue the pink inner ear to the black outer ear. Then, glue the nostrils to the upper portion of the pink circle/nose.
- 5. Glue the ears to the backside of the upper portion of the plate and the nose to the front of the bottom portion of the plate.
- 6. Now comes the fun part! Have your preschoolers glue the spots on the paper plate randomly. This is fun, because it makes every cow mask unique.
- 7. Once the spots are all on, you can add the eyes. You can cut the eyes out of paper, or you can use googly eyes.
- 8. To make this mask even more "mask like", you can cut out two eye holes. Then, your child can actually see through it when they wear it.
- 9. Now, glue a small ribbon bow to the front of one ear where it meets the plate. This step is totally optional, but it's one my daughter would have done for sure.
- 10. Your cow mask is finished!















Don't miss this adorable popsicle stick tractor craft for preschoolers! Add it to your farm or transportation themes for a fun craft activity.

Materials


- 7 green popsicle sticks
- Ilarge yellow button
- Ismall yellow button
- Glue
- Scissors

Instructions

- I. To begin, have a grown-up cut one green craft stick in half. Set one half aside. Cut the ends off of two more craft sticks. You may want to sand the rough edges down to prevent splinters before giving these to preschoolers.
- 2. Build the top of the tractor by placing the half stick on top of the other two sticks and gluing it in place.
- 3. Glue the remaining four popsicle sticks horizontally on the bottom half of the other two sticks. Stack each stick on top of the other to make the tractor's body.
- 4. Glue the large yellow button to the rear of the tractor and the small yellow button on the front.
- 5. Now the tractor is complete. As a fun little variation, you could glue your child's picture to the backside of the tractor so it looks as if they're driving it.


